Second place went to **Sam Blower** for an ingenious desk system intended for primary schools. The desks were interlocking and had inbuilt storage features

Third place went to **Milly Marsden** for a striking Point-of-Sale device linking an i-Pod with an amphibian charity.

Neha and Sam then went to the Rotary 1070 District Final at the Masque Theatre, Latimer Arts College, Kettering on Saturday June 26th. They put up a good show and explained their ideas well to the judges. However neither entrant managed to win one of the toughly contested prizes this year.
